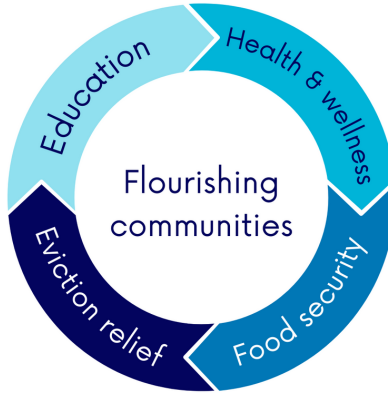

In January 2023, Star-C received a \$1 million grant from UnitedHealthcare to expand its programming in Cobb, DeKalb, Fulton & Clayton counties.

Star-C was thrilled to open four new sites this year: The Flats & Villas (for seniors) at Mt. Zion in Stockbridge, Amber Grove in Marietta, and Redwood Ridge in Forest Park, and expand our geographic reach to serve more low-income communities and working families. Star-C now serves eight communities with programming designed to address the social determinants of health for families in need. From providing afterschool and summer camp enrichment, wellness initiatives, eviction relief, and programs for senior citizens, Star-C's aim is to provide resources and combat transiency.

Willow Branch in Clarkston serves a diverse refugee population and has a well-established community garden onsite.



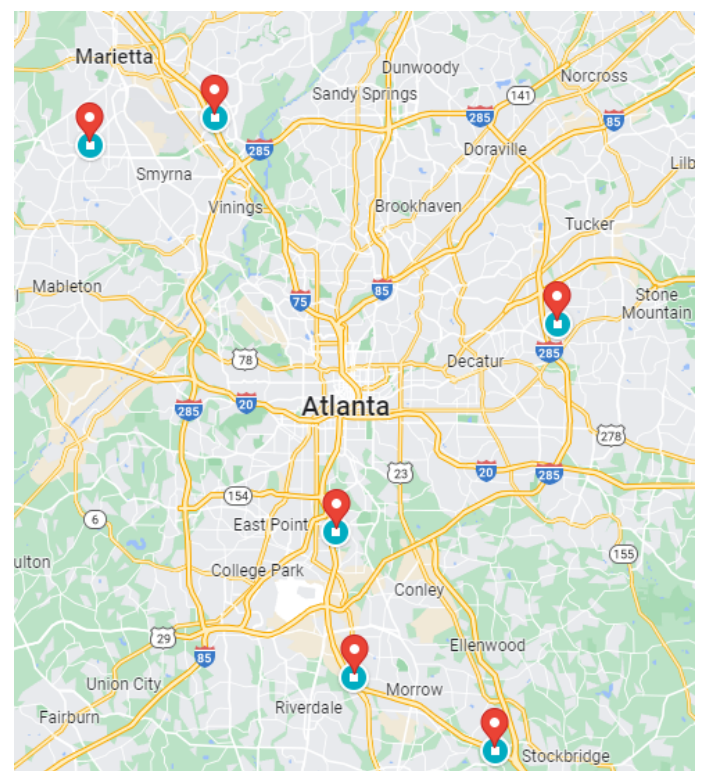
Summerdale and Springview, two communities in the City of Atlanta, had their transformation documented in "Blighted," written by Star-C founder, Marjy Stagmeier.

The Flats & Villas at Mt. Zion in Stockbridge boasts a brand new KaBoom! playground built in partnership with Delta Air Lines.



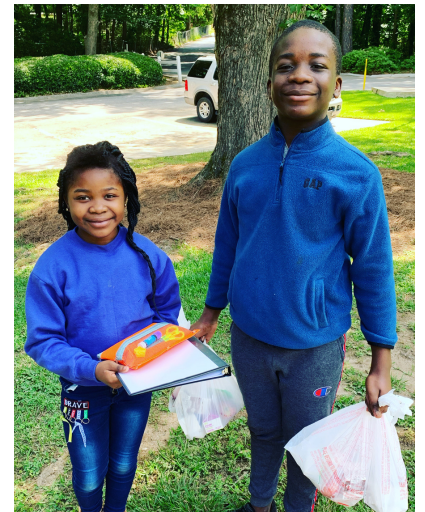


# LAUNCHING A BRAND NEW OFFERING: STAR-C SELECT
